Now the work begins to bring his family here – a completely different process, through the US Immigration Department. With help from many of us here and from some UU's in Massachusetts, Blaise's wife and children have just been able to leave Burundi and get to a much safer place, where with our continued support they will settle temporarily as the immigration process proceeds.
