## UUFC Composting and recycling

For a year we've worked at putting all food waste plus white napkins and paper towels into the organic waste bins. We have a volunteer who will check plastic “film” (bread and vegetable sacks etc.) and take appropriate ones to be recycled, so feel free to put these into a small plastic tub in the kitchen that is marked for it. Around town, some restaurants and non-profits have arrangements with Republic Services to compost certain types of paper plates and cups, but the UUFC does NOT have that arrangement so we cannot put paper cups and plates into our compost bin. We have an excellent system to sanitize glassware and china so we need to use only these washable items. Our goal is to have almost NO land-fill trash, as it takes space and contributes methane. Republic can capture some of the methane, but not all. Thanks for your participation toward making UUFC as close to zero waste as possible!
