The people, the struggle, and the hope that comes from the struggle

Unity To strive for and maintain unity in diversity, in the family and congregation.

Self-Determination To define ourselves, name ourselves, create for ourselves and speak for ourselves.

Creativity To do always as much as we can, in the way we can, in order to leave our community more beautiful and beneficial than we inherited it.

Collective Work and Responsibility To build and maintain our community together and make our brother's and sister's problems our problems and to solve them together.

Purpose To make our collective vocation the building and developing of our community in order to serve the causes of freedom, justice, wisdom and compassion, by developing the religious and spiritual capacities of each individual.

Faith To trust that life is worthwhile, that struggle is worthwhile, that we are capable of reaching our ideals. To trust in the larger flow of life and history, and the web of all life, and therefore to do our best for the whole.

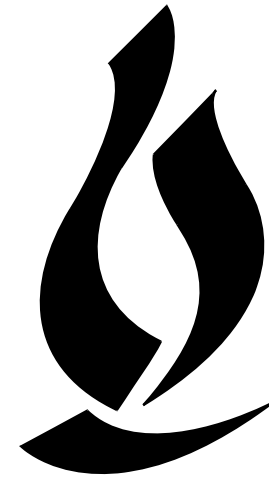
