# Between Us .....reflections from Jill

There are lots of things I don't understand these days, like 'cancel culture' and 'influencers,' and why calling someone Caucasian unconsciously supports white supremacy. (I'll keep reading.) I read a lot, trying to keep up with all this movement, and I'm often confused. Things change so quickly! So, before I come to convictions, I usually take a lot of time. People say to me "aren't you against this, and aren't you for this?" and much of the time I'm still listening. The truth is, that's always been my way. I've never been a leading political activist, or the first to take up the newest cause. I appreciate those who are. These days, what I'm listening for is how ideas and speech affect people. I'm moving in the direction of thinking free speech which offends people is OK – part of our democracy – none of us is immune to being offended. But when free speech encourages or enables harming people, I think limits need to be set. Don't ask me to debate this with you – I'm still thinking, and conversing and reading!

Meanwhile, life at the Fellowship is moving and changing, like everything else. Here are some of the changes in our Religious Exploration program: Rachel Kohler is moving into a new position of Interim Director of Religious Exploration. She'll be the hub of the RE program, and she'll also work with the new RE Council, chaired by Rachel Brinker and Skyla Cristisen, to move forward with the council's strategic plan. Plus, we're joining a collaborative RE venture, an alliance of ministers and RE staff in 4 congregations between here and the east coast, to provide lifespan RE. This is very exciting!

Other changes include the return of Connect Up (see elsewhere in this newsletter for more info), the inclusion of our greeter team and flower providers in each Sunday service, and the return of Jamie Petts to the office, from home. Jamie will spend lots of time this summer getting our new web site filled out and updated so that it can be the resource we need at our center in

What's not changing is our commitment to the health and safety of all, as we remain out of the building and grounds for as long as it takes. What's also not changing is our ability to stay connected and to help each other – this we have shown without a doubt. The need for us to let love live through us into the world has definitely not changed! Let's stay in this together. Thank you for all that you do!

**Summer RE Invitation from Rachel Kohler:** The RE department has been sending out RE Storytelling podcasts for several months now. You've heard lots of stories from me. But for the summer, wouldn't it be fun to hear some stories from you? If you and your family have a favorite story, Rachel would love to hear it! That's going to be our special summer RE project. Here's how this will work.

<u>Step One:</u> Choose a story. It can be a family favorite, a fairy tale, or even something you've made up! If you'd like some ideas, here's a good source: https://literacytrust.org.uk/family-zone/9-12/book-hopes/

<u>Step Two</u>: Record the story! Most smartphones have a recording app, but you can also use a computer that has a webcam. My go-to free audio software is Audacity. Try to record the story in as quiet a place as possible. Don't worry too much about mistakes; I can edit a lot of things out, including some background noises.

Step Three: Send me the audio file via email! Include the title of the story, the author, and who is reading it.

Step Four: I will edit the story into podcast format, complete with music and sound effects like I do with the stories I tell. I'll also come up with a cool craft or activity to go with it.

Step Five: Profit! Everyone at the Fellowship gets to hear your beautiful voices!

### **Pandemic Response**

Wearing a mask is now required in all indoor public spaces in Benton county, and the entire state of Oregon. Also, as of July 15, masks are also required in all outdoor spaces where social distancing of 6 feet or more is not possible. Wearing a mask is one of the most effective preventative measures. **COVID-19 cases continue to increase.** In Benton County, once again this week there is a record number of new cases. In too many states across the country, the virus is surging, and in several states the hospital capacity is now overwhelmed. It is clear that this is no time to loosen restrictions. Please continue to use as much precaution as possible.

**The Corvallis Sewing Brigade** has been operating since March 21, 2020 and has made and distributed 6,000 face shields, 400 Tyvek gowns, and 36,000 cloth reusable face masks. As they start to ratchet down production and distribution because there are more opportunities to obtain masks from other places and their sewists are tired:), they are downsizing their hub where their members go to pick up materials for mask making. **The new hub will now be located at entrance to the UUFC** and will be maintained by Elizabeth Wyatt and other brigade members.
