## Between Us.....reflections from Jill

A few more weeks of summer and then we begin a new church year. There are many great things to look forward to – a collaborative RE program with support and participation from five congregations; guest speakers and preachers who can join us because travel is not required; lots of great work with the UUtheVote team – because this is certainly the most important election of our lives!; and continuing to learn how to effectively be a congregation outside of our building, living our values and helping others.

I know – a positive attitude can be helpful, but it can also be annoying. Natalie Dattilo, PhD, a clinical health psychologist at Brigham and Women’s Hospital in Boston, notes that positivity can sometimes feel toxic - “like shoving ice cream into somebody’s face when they don’t feel like having ice cream. That’s not really going to make them feel better,” she said. Leaving opinions about ice cream aside, I agree that it’s very important to acknowledge all of our feelings about living in these challenging times. It is extremely difficult in so many ways, AND we are making our way, day by day, doing the best we can. All may not be fine in the end, but we will make it to the end of this particular challenge, and when we get there we will have changed in many ways, some of them sorely needed. I try to remember that the seeds I sow each day, now, will be sources of what I reap in the months and years ahead. I try, as often as possible, to sow seeds of love and compassion and wisdom – in myself, and for others. And I ask for help when I need it. May you too, sow seeds of love and compassion, and please, ask for help as often as you need to. We truly are all in this together.

### Fellowship Zoom Account for Small Group meetings

Coming soon, our Fellowship Zoom account will become available for small groups to reserve. These reservation requests should be limited to small meetings with not largely publicized meeting links, because security will be loosened in those meetings in order for us to enable non-staff members to host.

Is using the Fellowship Zoom account right for your group? The advantage: longer meetings (more than 40 minutes) are available using the Fellowship account. The disadvantages: 1. Scheduling with the office must occur, as we can still only host one meeting at a time, and 2. the Zoom security is not as strong.

In order to keep it as secure as possible, we need a team of a few people who are willing to host Fellowship Zoom meetings to be trained in how to do so. Let Jamie Petts know if you'd like to be trained.

To request use of the Fellowship Zoom account, check the church calendar first (<https://uucorvallis.org/calendar/>) to assure availability, then send an email to Jamie at [office@uucorvallis.org](mailto:office@uucorvallis.org) with the name of the event, date, and time. If it's reoccurring, please indicate that.

If you're using a personal Zoom account for a Fellowship meeting and would like the meeting to show up on the UUFC calendar so others can potentially join, please send the same information as above (name of the event, date, and time) to Jamie, note that it's a personal account, and she'll add it to the calendar.

**New guidance on the mask requirements were provided on August 13, with specific information for work places.**
