# Between Us.....reflections from Jill

We began this pandemic time five months ago (!) with an aim of "blessing the space between us," and I'd say we've done a very good job. The Fellowship has not been a source of COVID-19 for members, friends, staff or building users—that was and still is our goal. And more than that, we have continued to explore, love and act in both familiar and completely new ways. We have been equal to the challenge.

There can never be too many blessings! Let's begin the new church year with blessings from each to all. I need your help with this: For Sunday, Sept. 6, all are invited to write a blessing or two (or more) to be given as a gift to someone else in the Fellowship. Similar to the Czech flower ceremony which we have shared many times, in which we each bring a flower for someone else to take home, for this ceremony we'll each send a blessing that will then go to someone else in the Fellowship. What is a blessing? What words would you like to hear from someone else? Words of encouragement, inspiration, and comfort to help carry you through the coming year. Words you could read each day to be reminded of the gifts of community and connection. We have a week for writing: **Please send me your blessings by Sunday, August 23.** 

One more request: I'd love to hear from a few of you about what you've learned or discovered so far, during the pandemic. What have you discovered about yourself, about your assumptions and expectations, about your capacity for change, about what is truly important and what is not? I would be very happy for our Sunday service on August 30 to include some of you sharing lessons you've learned. Please let me know if you're interested.

Meanwhile, may these words from "You Still Dream" by poet Nikki Grimes, guide us: "But what's needed in this moment is unmixed confession of our nation's sin, deep and indefensible. 'Now I lay me down to sleep' must make way for something more muscular: sack cloth and ashes, prayer and fasting, naked prostration....radical repentance... Please heal our nation. Cleanse our stubborn hearts. Show each of us what part to play."

**RE News for Fall:** The UUFC Religious Exploration program is excited to partner with four other UU congregations across the country to provide a robust online RE experience for the 2020-2021 church year. The coalition is called "AFIRE: Alliance for Inspiring Religious Exploration." There will be online programs available for every age, from preschool activities to Coming of Age to parent groups to a substantial adult RE program called UUniversity. Online "open house" sessions will be held in early September, so stay tuned for details!

A New Weekly Connection Space – Fridays, 4 PM, via zoom. Fellowship member and Care and Support Team leader David Maxfield hosts a new weekly connection time for members and friends. "Heart to Heart: UUFC conversations about what is moving inside us," will be an open, facilitated conversation about whatever needs to be talked about. **New Communication Platforms for the Fellowship** Thank you to all who made suggestions about finding new and better ways to facilitate both discussions and connections during pandemic Fellowship life. Most likely, the current UU-Discuss listserv will be re-named and aimed more closely at sharing of community resources and needs (not necessarily Fellowship programs or events.) A new platform or platforms will be created to host important Fellowship conversations and discussions – this might use Slack or Canvas or some form of online bulletin board; all of these platforms make discussion threads easier to follow and summarize. Users of these platforms will agree to basic participation guidelines. As we launch these new platforms an open meeting will likely be held, to find out what conversations are most important between us now, and to talk about how to facilitate those conversations effectively. ## Fellowship Zoom Account for Small Group meetings

Coming soon, our Fellowship Zoom account will become available for small groups to reserve. These reservation requests should be limited to small meetings with not largely publicized meeting links, because security will be loosened in those meetings in order for us to enable non-staff members to host.

Is using the Fellowship Zoom account right for your group? The advantage: longer meetings (more than 40 minutes) are available using the Fellowship account. The disadvantages: 1. Scheduling with the office must occur, as we can still only host one meeting at a time, and 2. the Zoom security is not as strong.

In order to keep it as secure as possible, we need a team of a few people who are willing to host Fellowship Zoom meetings to be trained in how to do so. Let Jamie Petts know if you'd like to be trained.

To request use of the Fellowship Zoom account, check the church calendar first (https://uucorvallis.org/calendar/) to assure availability, then send an email to Jamie at office@uucorvallis.org with the name of the event, date, and time. If it's reoccurring, please indicate that.

If you're using a personal Zoom account for a Fellowship meeting and would like the meeting to show up on the UUFC calendar so others can potentially join, please send the same information as above (name of the event, date, and time) to Jamie, note that it's a personal account, and she'll add it to the calendar.
